DRIVING IN THE UK

You should read this chapter if you are planning on bringing your car to the UK, you will find the information you need to know on how to do this.

Also in this chapter you will find information on using your Irish Driving licence in the UK.

If I bring my car to the UK will I have to pay import duty?

You can bring a car into the UK from Ireland. No charges will be made as long as it is more than 6 months old and has travelled more than 6,000 kilometres under its own power.

Charges will apply if the car you wish to bring does not meet one or both of the requirements. In this case HM Revenue & Customs will classify the car as a New Means of Transport and you will have to pay duty on the vehicle.

If I have a full Irish driving licence will I have to exchange it for a UK licence?

If you move from Ireland to the UK to take up normal residence there, you do not have to exchange your Irish licence for a UK licence.

If for any reason you have to replace your driving licence you must replace it in the country that is considered to be your normal place of residence. In other words if you have to replace your Irish driving licence and you are normally resident in the UK you will have to replace it with a UK licence.
